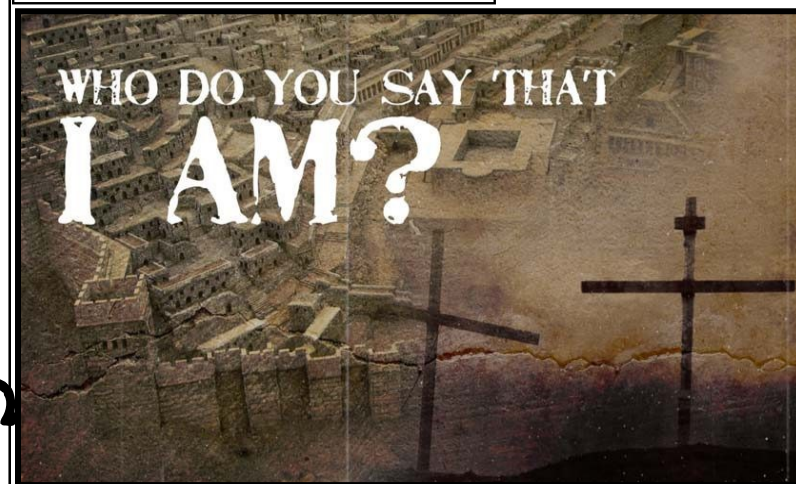

St Thomas More: Thursday is EU Referendum Day. Maybe we should take to heart the prayer of St Thomas More whose feast falls on Wed 22nd June. The Saint Thomas More prayer for good humour begins: "Grant me, O Lord, good digestion, and also something to digest. Grant me a healthy body, and the necessary good humour to maintain it. Grant me a simple soul that knows to treasure all that is good and that doesn't frighten easily at the sight of evil, but rather finds the means to put things back in their place."

Give me a soul that knows not boredom, grumblings, sighs and laments, nor excess of stress, because of that obstructing thing called 'I.' Grant me, O Lord, a sense of good humour. Allow me the grace to be able to take a joke to discover in life a bit of joy, and to be able to share it with others."

St John Fisher executed like Thomas More by Henry VIII said the following to the Bishop of Winchester who had given up the Catholic Faith, "Had you but tasted one drop of the sweetness which inebriates the souls of those religious from their worship of this Sacrament, you would never have written as you have, nor have apostatized from the faith that you formerly professed." He also said elsewhere: "A good man is not a perfect man; a good man is an honest man, faithful and unhesitatingly responsive to the voice of God in his life."

Motion at Scottish Parliament proposed by Clare Adamson MSP 15th June 2016

That the Parliament congratulates the Society of St Vincent de Paul on holding a highly successful clothing giveaway in the Loyola Centre in Wishaw on 11 June 2016; notes that the event aimed to provide access to high quality new and pre-loved clothing for all ages in the Wishaw, Motherwell, Cleland and Newmains areas; understands that some 300 people attended the event and took away a large volume of clothing of all types; recognises that this initiative successfully addressed the needs of many local people whose family budget does not extend to smart clothes for interview, for work or for special functions; notes the dedication of members of the parish of St Ignatius of Loyola in organising the event with assistance from the team at Dress for Success Strathclyde on how to sort and present items; further notes the generosity of the clothing manufacturers, Oxford Blue Classic English Country Clothing and Versatile Sports, which donated some £8,000 worth of new clothing; applauds also the support to the event from local traders Asda (Newmains), Lloyds Pharmacy, Ladbrokes, Stanford Logistics and Mainetti Trading Fashion, and considers that this is an excellent example of local collaboration to offer practical help to those in need. **WELL DONE TO OUR SVDP CONFERENCE!**
