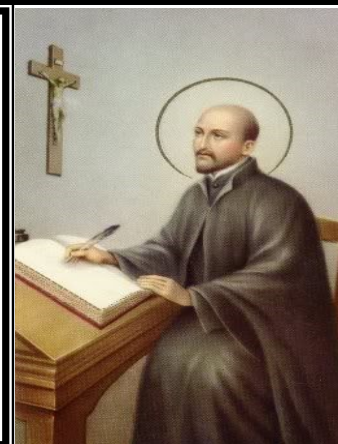

Ash Wednesday 17th February 2021

This will be a different Lent than before, as a result:

*"The Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments asked priests to take special anti-COVID-19 precautions this year when distributing ashes on Ash Wednesday (February 17th) including sprinkling ashes on the top of people's heads rather than using them to make a cross on people's forehead."*

Sprinkling on the top of the head is normal in many European Countries. All of this will depend on what situation we are in by then and what restrictions are in place.
